To Whom It May Concern:

We represent the *Gardens at Bridgehampton Condominium Association, Inc.* (the "Association") with regard to claims arising from the negligent construction of the condominiums. We write to provide you with an update regarding the Association's claims. Specifically, this letter is to provide basic information regarding the Association's claims to third parties who inquire regarding the status of the litigation.

The Association's consultants have completed their initial investigation and a report has been generated and circulated to the Board. Given the results of the investigation, and upon advice of counsel, the Board authorized us to issue a presuit notice to entities responsible for the work performed at the Project. The Board also authorized the filing of a lawsuit against the same entities. This information will be available via public records via Duval County Clerk of The Court. http://www2.duvalclerk.com/records/

We reasonably anticipate that litigation will last approximately two years, although it could be shorter or longer depending on the circumstances. In the lawsuit, the Association seeks to recover funds sufficient to pay for the repairs; however, if sufficient funds are not recovered to cover the cost of the repairs, an assessment may be necessary.
